The **Historic Aviation Memorial Museum** re-opened its doors to the public on the 8th of May, 2020 — to coincide with the **75th Anniversary of the Allied Victory in Europe**.

Until further notice the Museum will be open **Fridays and Saturdays only**, from **10:00 am to 4:00 pm**. The expenses remain the same while the income is greatly diminished. **Please consider making whatever financial contributions you can to help us through this difficult time.**

In case you missed it:

The last election cycle resulted in the election or reelection of three members of the Museum's Board of Directors. Congratulations to **Lou Thomas, Ken Toby, and Warren Moore** whose terms of service are effective through 2022. Lou, who has been President for the past five years, is weaning himself off the lion's share of responsibilities by stepping down to Vice President and offloading some of his collateral duties (including responsibility for publishing the *Prop Wash*) onto other members. Have patience as those of us not quite as awesome as Lou figure these things out.

Bob Strong is our new **President**. Despite his name he'll be needing all the support we can give him piloting the Museum through uncharted territory.

Former Vice President **Chip Williams** has taken on the challenges of **Curator**, a job where there's always a dozen or more things to be done before it's time to move on to the next project that needs to be done.

Our other Vice President, **Warren Moore**, is now responsible for **Hanger Operations**.

Gail Strong continues to organize and operate the largest collection of aviation-related books you'll ever see.

Why an Aviation Museum?

- Recognize the aviation pioneers of yesterday
- Serve as a tribute and source of pride for those serving their country and pioneering aircraft for personal and military use
- Help ensure future generations will proudly recognize the aviation advancements of Texans and the citizens of our nation
- Ensure that the aviation history of the 20th Century and beyond is not forgotten

In addition to preserving history and educating the public, HAMM also places a great emphasis on generating interest and educating young people on opportunities in aviation. Tours for school groups, the flight simulator, and the week-long Aviation Camps in the Summer are all methods used by our volunteers to reach out to youth in Tyler and surrounding areas.

Volunteers are sorely needed to keep the Museum functioning. Whether you're a people person, an organizer, a history buff, love airplanes, or just want to *tinker in your workshop and be left alone*, **your talents are needed.**

If you have a newly retired husband getting on your nerves, there's a job for him here. If you're a young person going to school and/or working part time needing to network and build your resume, this is where you belong.

Even if this isn't for you, you know someone who needs to come check out the Museum with an eye toward volunteering. One day a week is all we ask, and that isn't too much of a contribution to make to help preserve—and perpetuate—our rich aviation history.

With the reopening of the Museum, COVID-19 guidelines have been implemented and so far everything seems to be going smoothly. Following the guidelines requires more volunteers to monitor visitors, provide services to individuals and small family groups, and engage in ongoing cleaning and sanitizing. In the past, visitors would often group together at a particular exhibit, and would almost always be combined to tour the static aircraft displays. Due to social distancing requirements we can no longer permit this.

For now we are open only two days a week. If the Museum is to survive we'll need to be open more frequently, and to do that we need more volunteers.
